Benefits of Community Engagement:

- Diversity of research participants
- Funding success with inclusion of community engagement in proposals
- Improved translation/implementation of research findings
- Promote equity in research and outcomes for communities

Community Stakeholders may include:

Patients, researchers, clinicians, payors, industry, hospital and health systems, policy makers, training institutions

Community Engaged Research is on a continuum:

Stakeholders may be involved in community outreach and education, consultants, collaborators and/or involved in dissemination of findings

Challenges:

- Time to establish relationships with stakeholders
- Negotiate differences among community stakeholders and researchers
- Funding requirement needs

Infrastructure needed:

- Personnel
- Discretionary funds
- Meeting space
- Communication channels
- Capacity/skill building training materials
