What is Reaffirmation of Accreditation?

The Southern Association of Colleges and Schools Commission on Colleges' (SACSCOC) Reaffirmation of Accreditation is a comprehensive internal and external review process to ensure that member institutions maintain continuing compliance with Commission policies and with <u>The Principles of</u> <u>Accreditation: Foundation for Quality</u> <u>Enhancement.</u>

According to SACSCOC, "At the heart of SACSCOC's philosophy of accreditation, the concept of quality enhancement presumes each member institution is to be engaged in ongoing improvement of its programs and services and be able to demonstrate how well it fulfills its stated mission. Although evaluation of an institution's educational quality and effectiveness in achieving its mission is a difficult task requiring careful analysis and professional judgment, an institution is expected to document the quality and effectiveness of all its programs and services.".

SECTION 12: ACADEMIC & SUPPORT SERVICES 12.6: Student Debt & Financial Literacy

Standard 12.6: <u>The institution provides information and guidance to help student</u> <u>borrowers understand how to manage their debt and repay their loans.</u>

Baylor College of Medicine (BCM) provides information and guidance to help student borrowers understand how to manage debt and repay their loans. BCM utilizes a multifaceted approach to help students understand how to manage educational debt and repay loans. Programs and activities are provided to all students across the Houston and Temple campuses through the Office of Education Affairs and Office of Student Financial Aid (OSFA).

Financial Management Programs and Activities

The OSFA's mission is to assist and counsel students in obtaining financial assistance for their education, as well as educate students on the importance of understanding their financial obligations, both while enrolled and after graduation. At BCM, to practice financial literacy and effective loan debt management we emphasize how crucial it is for students to understand that financial literacy empowers them to make informed decisions and build a solid foundation for their future careers.

BCM assists students in understanding their student debt and repayment of loans using multiple support options including financial literacy and debt management online modules, one on one counseling, and online resources.

BCM offers a full range of financial literacy options to all students, regardless of whether they are financial aid recipients or not. All students are required to complete a financial literacy module annually. This module includes information on types of debt, borrowing practices, investments, retirement, credit scores, and budgeting.

Should students need additional resources, the financial aid website has a Financial Wellness component that students can access at their own convenience. Students still needing resources have the option of contacting a Financial Aid Counselor for more in-depth discussions.

Students who are recipients of federal aid (currently or previously) are required to complete a one-on-one personal student loan debt management counseling. This is a two-part training course which includes an online Debt Management module. After the module is complete, the students are required to schedule a one-on-one Debt Management session with a financial aid counselor to review the information specific to their debt. The counselor prepares a detailed package of information to include their current borrowing amounts, projected repayment schedules, and grace period. This information is reviewed with the student and the counselor offers guidance on how to manage their debt and repayment plan options.

Loan Counseling & Resources

Coordinated by the Office of Student Financial Aid, staff ensure/provide the following:

- Allow borrowing only within the cost of attendance.
- Provide each student borrower with an award notification link, where the student can review a summary of the total loans borrowed at the College. The link to the National Student Loan Data System is also available for each student to review his/her federal student loan history.
- Provide comprehensive entrance and exit loan counseling.

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All students accepting federal loans are required to complete online entrance counseling [8]. Counseling details the rights and responsibilities of borrowing and how to manage their debt. This information is also repeated during the orientation sessions.

There is also mandatory online exit counseling on the Student Federal Aid site for those students beginning repayment after graduation. Information handouts are also provided regarding loan repayment options, grace periods, forbearance and deferments.

There is also a mandatory online loan exit counseling session for borrowers of BCM institutional student loans. This exit counseling session reiterates the terms of these loans as stated in the loan promissory note, and it requires the borrower to take a short quiz confirming understanding of their rights and responsibilities. The Office of Student Account Services notifies student loan borrowers of this requirement prior to graduation and verifies completion before students are cleared to graduate.

The OSFA provides both printed and online debt management information to all students. Resources include both internal and external information, including AAMC resources. Information is distributed by email and through the Office of Education Affair's Student Commons Newsletter.

The office maintains a Financial Wellness webpage to provide students at BCM:

- Virtual and in-person appointments
- Financial counseling and other financial wellness resources through Academic Live Care (ALC)
- Information about sources of aid
- Medical Student Financial Wellness resources
- Financial Literacy and Loan Debt Management resources
- Net Price Calculator
- Money management checklist
- Resources for scholarships
- Financial Aid provides virtual financial wellness sessions. Topics include "Importance of Saving", "Banking Basics for Students", and "Managing Your Money".

Offices Responsible for Providing Information and Guidance

Office of Student Financial Aid

All financial aid staff members assist all students in all programs across both campuses. The Office of Financial Aid is staffed with six professionals: a senior manager, three financial aid counselors, and two academic services coordinators.
