SACSCOC ROAD TO REAFFIRMATION UPDATE

In September 2025, Baylor College of Medicine proudly submitted its Compliance Certification as part of the reaffirmation process for accreditation by the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools Commission on Colleges (SACSCOC). This milestone reflects our unwavering commitment to academic excellence, institutional integrity, and continuous improvement.

We are now in the next phase—awaiting the off-site review. This important step will help ensure that our programs and operations continue to meet the highest standards of quality and accountability. Baylor College of Medicine will be hosting our SACSCOC Mock Site Visit from January 12th to 15th, 2026.

We extend our heartfelt thanks to the many faculty, staff, and supporters who have contributed their time, expertise, and dedication throughout this journey. Your efforts have been instrumental in helping Baylor College of Medicine uphold its mission and values. We look forward to the next chapter in this reaffirmation process with confidence and gratitude.



SACSCOC NEWS

In response to recent concerns regarding the relevance and perceived political messaging within current accreditation standards, the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools Commission on Colleges (SACSCOC) is launching a comprehensive review and revision process beginning October 2025. This initiative is expected to span 14-18 months.

The revision will focus on:

- Streamlining standards to enhance clarity and usability
- Differentiating expectations to better reflect institutional diversity
- Aligning with workforce and economic development priorities

Additionally, updates to the Principles of Accreditation will provide a foundation for improving process efficiency. A key outcome will be the development of stronger, mission-based criteria to support emerging Distinction Designations.

To ensure transparency and balance, the review will include input from state legislators and leaders in economic and workforce development as part of a broader bias assessment.

SACSCOC remains committed to maintaining rigorous, mission-driven standards that support institutional excellence and public trust.

LCME ELEMENT 7 UPDATE

The structure of new Standard 7 was approved in principle by the LCME in February 2025. It has been revised based on the inclusion of Element 7.3, which was added to address the explicit requirement for content related to "nutrition" The revision that includes new Element 7.3 was initially approved by the LCME in September 2025. The table below shows the proposed standard and element language. The LCME will now consider comments in its review of the proposed new Standard 7 at its February 2026 meeting. If finally approved, the revised standard and elements, with their associated DCI questions, would be effective in academic year 27-28.

CURRENT Standard Language (AY 2025-26)

Standard 7 (curricular content) The faculty of a medical school ensure that the medical curriculum provides content of sufficient breadth and depth to prepare medical students for entry into any residency program and for the subsequent contemporary practice of medicine.

Standard 7 (curricular content) The medical education curriculum provides content and experiences of sufficient breadth and depth to prepare medical students for entry into any graduate medical education program, for the subsequent practice of contemporary medicine, and for applying self-directed learning and critical thinking across the educational program competencies.

ARC-PA UPDATE

ARC-PA Commission approved the 6th Edition of the Standards for Entry Level PA Programs The ARC-PA is pleased to announce that the Commission has approved the 6th Edition of the Standards for entry-level PA programs. These Standards went to effect on September 1, 2025.

The Compliance Manual can be found <u>here</u>. The 6th edition of the Standards includes minor changes that are expected to translate into significant improvements for programs. Some of the upgrades include:

- Full payment for principal faculty board certification and licensure
- · Principal faculty may hold PA-C emeritus status
- Protected 50% effort for program director administrative responsibilities.
- Medical directors may be currently or previously certified PAs or physicians
- Preceptors may be currently or previously board-certified
- Added maintenance of personal wellness didactic instruction
- Added telehealth/telemedicine to didactic and clinical instruction
- Streamlined the self-assessment requirements https://lnkd.in/euacycYW

DNP: LEADING THE WAY

Davis elected president of nurse anesthesia group

Dr. Rachel Davis, director of the DNP Program - Nurse Anesthesia in the School of Health Professions, was elected president of the Council on Accreditation of Nurse Anesthesia Educational Programs (COA). COA is responsible for the accreditation of institutions and programs of nurse anesthesia at the postmaster's and postdoctoral certificate, master's or doctoral degree levels in the U.S. and its territories. Davis was elected to this position after serving as champion of the special interest group that recently revised the standards for nurse anesthesia educational programs.
