He is board certified in general surgery, surgical critical care, and cardio-thoracic surgery. At Ben Taub he has held positions including director of Emergency Surgical Services, chief of General Surgery, chief of Surgical Critical Care, chief of Cardiothoracic Surgery, medical director of Trauma, deputy chief of Surgery and chair of the Medical Executive Board.
