<u>Profiles in Professionalism</u>	This lecture series brings outstanding inspirational speakers to Baylor quarterly to discuss a wide range of professionalism related topics.	Offered in collaboration with the Department of Medicine (Thursdays at noon), and to the greater BCM community later in the afternoon	General professionalism topics
<u>Professionalism Grand Rounds</u>	A one-hour interactive overview of the why, what and how of professionalism.	Entire BCM community (offered to clinical and basic science departments, centers, administrative staff)	To promote a shared vision of the definition and behavioral skills to promote positive professionalism
<u>Workshops and Retreats (customizable)</u>	The Center provides education and training in all key areas of professionalism	Entire BCM community; these sessions can be customized to reach your group's educational goals.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Communication • Teamwork • Conflict resolution • Burnout • Improving the learning environment • Interprofessional collaboration
<u>Professionalism Breakfasts</u>	Provides an opportunity for peer-to-peer discussion about realistic professionalism concerns.	Entire BCM Community (frequently requested for residents, but available to any group)	Customized vignettes depicting professionalism challenges (tailored to participants)
<u>Student Elective (Professionalism Platform)</u>	8-session course which teaches professionalism using a visual model, based on evidence from peer-reviewed literature and emotional intelligence principles. Create a community of individuals who function within a culture of heightened familiarity, trust, and respect.

<u>Connection Cards</u>	Monthly graphic emails with an inspiring professionalism quote ; initiated at the beginning of the pandemic to offer encouragement .	Entire BCM community
<u>Summit Speakers</u>	Many of our faculty members are invited all over the country, all over the world, to discuss their unique insights, yet they may speak only infrequently at their “home” institution. The Summit Speaker is an annual opportunity to feature a BCM faculty member , speaking about their own career journey or a professionalism topic of their choice.	Entire BCM community
<u>Muffins with Mentors</u>	This program offers an informal setting for students and junior faculty to meet with a senior faculty member regarding their career journey and insights into successes and challenges they have faced.	Learners and junior faculty
<u>Wellness Initiatives</u>	These are collaborations with Baylor’s BeWell Team to promote wellness within our community; examples include the Hap-Pie-ness Project, the Sound of Well-Being and 3 Good Things.	Entire BCM Community
<u>Professionalism Partners</u>	The Partners consist of a nominated group representing each school and clinical campus , who contribute actively to create a culture of civility, compassion, and connection through professionalism.	Entire BCM Community



Validate, appreciate, and encourage examples of **positive professionalism**.

Activity	Description	Intended Audience
<u>POP Awards</u>	Power of Professionalism (POP) awards are based on an observed example of positive professional behavior.	Entire BCM Community (nominations accepted / awards given year-round)
<u>PEAR Award</u>	The Professional Educator And Recognition (PEAR) initiative validates mentors who have had a significant impact on students.	Entire BCM Community (students may nominate educators at any level; awards given year-round)
<u>Clark Service Award</u>	Recognizes individuals who demonstrate extraordinary service and have not received any other major BCM awards	Clinical or Basic Science Faculty (annual); faculty may nominate another faculty member
<u>Ben and Margaret Love Foundation Bobby Alford Award for Academic Clinical Professionalism</u>	Honors an individual who has modeled professionalism and humanism throughout their career	Clinical or Basic Science Faculty (annual); nominations by Department Chairs or Center Directors



Establish **accountability** in an approach lapses in professionalism in a respectful, consistent, and constructive manner.

Activity	Description	Intended Audience
<u>Cups of Coffee</u>	Perceived lapses in professionalism can be addressed with a “cup of coffee” -- an informal conversation with a member of the Center for Professionalism to promote reflection and self-regulation.	Information about the “cup of coffee” referral process is available online
<u>Consultations</u>	Available to discuss approaches for individuals or groups to navigate professionalism challenges	Entire BCM Community



Maximize collegiality and **interprofessional teamwork**.

Activity	Description	Intended Audience
<u>Interdepartmental Civility Projects</u>	Facilitate discussion between two departments or specialties to address conflicts , promote empathy and increase productive collaborations .	Entire BCM Community (customizable based on involved groups)
<u>“Threads Among Us”</u>	This one-hour workshop includes a 7-minute video intended to increase physician empathy towards other physicians and health care team members .	Entire BCM Community



Demonstrate leadership in professionalism **scholarly activity**.

Activity	Description	Intended Audience
<u>Mini Grants</u>	Awards (up to \$2000) given to support individuals with professionalism-related scholarly projects	Entire BCM Community (rolling acceptance of grant applications)
<u>Interprofessional collaborations resulting in podium presentations and publications</u>	Available for mentorship and support in bringing a professionalism-related scholarly project to fruition. These collaborations have produced scholarly work such as podium presentations and publications.	Entire BCM Community
