#### **CRIS: History, Principles, and On-Going Offerings**

The Center for Research, Innovationand Scholarship in Medical Education was established in 2012 as one of the first medical education centers in the nation associated with a freestanding children's hospital. To recognize the scholarly work that faculty, residents, and fellows were doing, in addition to clinical and basic research, the Center was formed as part of a larger educational initiative, with Dr. Teri Turner as Founding Director.

From a small core faculty, CRIS now has ten core faculty members and two CRIS scholars, under the direction of Dr. Satid Thammasitboon. CRIS fosters opportunities for medical faculty members, residents, and fellows to conduct scholarly research about teaching, to experiment with innovative approaches, and to implement best practices.

As it has grown, it has broadened its scope to include seminars, workshops, and a Faculty College. It now publishes its own newsletter and a "One Page" announcement of various educational opportunities. #### Symposium Highlight: Educator Shares Her Experiences in Medical Educator

**Dr. Teri Lee Turner**, Professor and Martin I Lorin Endowed Chair in Medical Education, Department of Pediatrics, Baylor College of Medicine, was a speaker at the 21<sup>st</sup> annual Henry J. N. Taub & James K. Alexander Medical Student Research Symposium, held on Thursday, March 25, 2021. The research day was held virtually due to distancing restrictions related to COVID-19.

The Symposium provides a formal mechanism whereby medical students showcase their research projects (clinical, translational, basic science, and educational research). Poster presentations, along with recorded narratives, were uploaded on VoiceThread and available for viewing throughout the day. Live Zoom sessions engaged participants in discussions giving them opportunities to give praise, ask questions, provide



recommendations, and engage in networking. Several Zoom rooms ran simultaneously and allowed participants to move from one to another as they chose.

The Department of Medicine hosted a Meet-and-Greet session to introduce DOM physician-scientists from various disciplines. Participants had the opportunity to meet DOM faculty and learn about their clinical, translational, basic science, and educational research projects.

Dr. Turner, who also serves as the Vice Chair of Educational Affairs and Assistant Dean for Graduate Medical Education, as well as having been the Founding Director of the Center for Research, Innovation and Scholarship in Medical Education, was the first speaker addressing educational research. She shared her story and the vision that has guided her throughout her career as a clinician-educator and national acclaimed educational scholar. She is the author of a Clinician-Educator's Handbook, designed to aid clinicians in the day-to-day teaching responsibilities, as well as numerous articles and book chapters.

An awards presentation as held at the end of the symposium, and the recipients of the Henry J. N. Taub Young Investigator Awards were announced for each category.

#### **Education Grand Rounds Focused on Coaching**



The Education Grand Rounds, held on Thursday, April 22, focused on "Educator Self-Improvement Through Guided Reflection and Feedback." The session, presented by

Dr. Sandra Haudek, Associate Professor of Medicine, Baylor College of Medicine, discussed how the BCM peer coaching program helps facilitate self improvement. The main topics were "Engagement," "Retention," "Collaboration," "Fun!" "Feedback," "Facilitation," and "Innovation." # Global Health Scholarship Community of Practice (CoP) Program

The **Global Health Scholarship Community of Practice (CoP) Program** seeks to foster excitement and collaboration around scholarship among local staff across the 9 countries in the BIPAI Network and faculty at BCM/TCH. The program consists of a monthly Core Series, that focuses on enhancing fundamental scholarly skills, and a monthly CoPs session, that brings together smaller interest groups to share and explore collaborations.

Ninety-two unique members from Argentina, Botswana, Colombia, Lesotho, Malawi, Romania, Tanzania, Uganda, and the United States have participated in eight sessions thus far. CoP members have been interacting on the Virtual Home, an online platform supporting community engagement and knowledge sharing that serves as the main communication channel for the CoP Program. The CoP Program is hosting the first BIPAI RAISE (Research. Arts. Innovation. Scholarship. Education) Symposium June 28- July 2. The Symposium aims to catalyze the exchange of ideas through a showcase of innovative abstracts and interactive sessions, enhance education and research skills through workshops, foster a culture of scholarship, and promote a holistic approach to global health through arts and wellness. As part of the capacity building efforts of the CoP Program, the Program has facilitated 20 peer coaches to support authors of 37 unique abstracts to prepare their best submissions.

The Global Health Network provides access to the extensive resources of world-class institutions and expert technical assistance, staff presence, and support for physical infrastructure to our Network of independent, local NGO implementing partners in Argentina, Botswana, Colombia, Eswatini, Lesotho, Malawi, Romania, Tanzania, and Uganda. It operates 15 Centers of Excellence (COE) and satellites for outpatient maternal and child health services across three continents .
