 - 60-minute consultation for general advice related to the content and format of the submission
 - 60-minute consultation followed by review and written feedback of the draft submission
 - review and written feedback of a completed draft submission (submitted at the time of application for coaching support) and a 60-minute consultation if required
- communicate directly with the author(s) to arrange the date/time of consultations
- for authors needing it, provide written feedback to candidates by March 5

BEME systematic review is similar to Cochrane review but in health professions education.

BEME Reviews require a unique set of skills with different philosophical and theoretical underpinning to determine ways of enhancing outcomes of an educational intervention and/or the effective processes of teaching and learning.

Scoping reviews represent an increasingly popular approach to reviewing health research evidence.

A scoping review involves 'mapping,' a process of summarizing a range of evidence, and analytical reinterpretation of the evidence in order to convey the breadth and depth of a field.

The Course draws on experience gained with the Best Evidence Medical Education (BEME)
Collaboration. It is appropriate for a broad audience interested in developing a set of core skills that are key in conducting various types of knowledge synthesis in the healthcare professions as the new venue for scholarly outputs.


