Interfaith Panel for World Religions Day, Jan. 18, 12-1 p.m.: Originating in 1950, the purpose of World Religion Day is to highlight the idea that the spiritual principles underlying the world's religions are harmonious, and that religions play a significant role in humanity. In the context of healthcare, this is an opportunity to consider the shared ways in which religious traditions approach health, healing, and the body, and also to better understand where they diverge.
