2022 FUELING HOPE CONFERENCE WITH DR. GONZALEZ



Sandra Gonzalez, MSSW, Ph.D. delivered the keynote address together with Sam MacMaster, Ph.D., MSSA, at this year's Fueling Hope conference. Dr. Gonzalez also gave a presentation on co-occurring mental health and substance use disorders. Family and Community Medicine recently received funding

from the Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration (SAMHSA) to continue the Fueling Hope project partnership between Baylor College of Medicine and Behavioral Health Solutions of South Texas. The project aims at increasing care for racial and ethnic underrepresented individuals who have substance use disorders and/or co-occurring mental health disorders and are at risk for or live with HIV/AIDS and receive HIV/AIDS services/treatment. The FCM team will provide training, technical assistance, evaluation services, and facilitation of professional events.

INEBRIA EDINBURGH 2022 CONFERENCE WITH DR. GONZALEZ AND DR. ZOOROB

Dr. Gonzalez, along with Roger Zoorob, M.D., MPH, FAAFP, attended the International Network on Brief Interventions for Alcohol and Other Drugs (INEBRIA) conference, which took



place in Edinburgh, Scotland. They presented findings from two completed projects focused on providing substance use disorder treatment for racial, gender, and sexual minority populations in the Greater Houston area and the Rio Grande Valley in Texas.






FCM MEDICAL STUDENTS PRESTIGIOUS SCHOLARSHIP AWARD







FACULTY DEVELOPMENT DAY INAUGURAL CONFERENCE



ALSO® PROVIDER COURSE YEARLY PROGRAM


FACULTY AND TRAINING ACTIVITIES **VARIOUS WORKS**

Mónica M. Alzate, Ph.D., LCSW delivered a presentation on common mental health concerns to 100 college students at Rice University a day after a student's death on campus. She also gave a behavioral health consultation to Monroe Clinic providers, assessing the management of domestic violence cases in the clinic. This experience is being used to develop a quality improvement project. In addition, Dr. Alzate read her essay during Baylor College of Medicine's Hispanic Heritage Month poetry/essay reading.

Fabrizia Faustinella, M.D., Ph.D., FACP offered her clinical expertise to the Houston Health Department on contact tracing, testing, and TPOXX prescription in response to the Monkeypox outbreak. As Co-Chair of the Texas American College of Physicians (TX-ACP) Health and Public Policy Committee (HPPC), she presented the committee's work to the Board of Directors during the American College of Physicians Annual Scientific Meeting in October. Furthermore, she wrote, produced, and directed a video project titled "[The Person at the Center.](#)"

Roger Zoorob, M.D., MPH, FAAFP hosted a virtual training session for primary care providers in August on Lung Cancer Screening and Prevention in Primary Care: Updated Guidelines & Best Practices. Additionally, Maria Mejia, M.D., MPH, FACPM presented at the Family and Community Medicine Grand Rounds in September on lung cancer screening (low-dose CT) and tobacco cessation program services and referrals for PCPs. In October, Dr. Mejia discussed the program and referral process with a group of medical directors from the University of Texas.

Mental Health Awareness Training (MHAT) faculty, Sandra Gonzalez, MSSW, Ph.D. and Dr. Alzate, have trained 549 people from July through the beginning of October. In July, MHAT faculty exhibited a mental health poster at a health fair in Northline Houston, which is a predominantly Hispanic community. During Domestic Awareness Month in October, a two-part training on domestic violence was offered to the public and Dr. Alzate wrote about [the topic in the BCM Momentum blog](#). Current and upcoming MHAT trainings involve providers with the Monroe Clinic as well as the Cypress and Casa de Amigos Health Centers, school counselors from Pearland ISD, Harris County Community Supervision & Corrections staff, mental health professionals affiliated with the Network of Behavioral Health Providers (NBHP), and FCM residents. 



