



BRINGING ALCOHOL AND OTHER DRUG RESEARCH TO PRIMARY CARE IN-PERSON SYMPOSIUMS

Bringing Alcohol and Other Drug Research to Primary Care is a collaborative project between Behavioral Health Solutions of South Texas (BHSST) and Baylor College of Medicine. This program promotes current evidence-based recommendations on preventing and treating alcohol, nicotine, and opioid use disorders in primary care settings. In February, BHSST hosted symposiums in McAllen and Corpus Christi, Texas. Family and Community Medicine faculty and staff presented educational content to local providers, including behaviorists and family medicine physicians. CME and CEU credits were offered to participants.
