PLUS ANNUAL REPORT

Throughout the second half of FY2024, several teams in the department were highly involved in numerous scholarly activities. From January to June, 101 posters and presentations were submitted to various conferences and academic gatherings. Faculty, staff, and fellows authored 23 manuscripts published within that timeframe. In the last six months, over 20 new faces joined our administration, private clinics, and research programs, as well as Healthcare for the Homeless – Houston. Plus, the department gained a research postdoctoral fellow and enrolled 11 medical graduates entering our family medicine residency in FY2025. 10-YEAR REVIEW

NOTABLE MOMENTS	Throughout the decade that Roger Zoorob, M.D., MPH, FAAFP has been the chair of Family and Community Medicine, the department has achieved many milestones in primary care research, clinical and community service, and medical education.
2014	Shortly after Dr. Zoorob accepted the leadership role in March, he spearheaded the development of the department's official research center, with a focus on addressing topics impacting population health and prevention.
2015	The department sponsored the first annual Primary Care Update, a one-day, CME non-commercial conference with lectures on a range of health-related subjects and evidence-based recommendations.
2016	Faculty providing substance use treatment for patients at Santa Maria Hostel supported the expansion of the office-based substance use treatment model to include medication for opioid and alcohol use disorders.
2017	In response to the community's healthcare needs during the aftermath of Hurricane Harvey, several faculty volunteered their medical services at the shelters in the George R. Brown Convention Center and NRG Stadium.
2018	Four years after the department began offering the Advanced Life Support in Obstetrics (ALSO®) provider course, the SonoSim Workshop was added to the program to enhance the learning experience with hands-on training.


10-YEAR REVIEW

2019	Baylor Medicine Family Medicine expanded by adding a private clinic in the prime location of Houston's River Oaks, with more than a dozen exam rooms, on-site laboratory and radiology services, and same-day appointments.
2020	In preparation for the changes in healthcare brought about by the COVID-19 pandemic, the department created the Telemedicine 101-104 series for providers, teaching how to conduct televisits and video visits, and utilize Zoom and Doximity.
2021	Family and Community Medicine's First Annual Research Day provided a new platform for faculty, residents, fellows, and medical students to share their presentations on varying research and quality improvement endeavors.
2022	The Baylor Family Medicine Residency Program welcomed the inaugural class on the rural residency track, integrating the partnership with St. Luke's Health- Memorial Lufkin for training while serving East Texas communities.
2023	An open house was held by Baylor Medicine Family Medicine with Baylor College of Medicine leadership, faculty, and staff in attendance, promoting the private clinic at the Texas Medical Center that moved to Fannin Tower.
2024	Beginning in FY2024, FCM faculty collaborated with counterparts at Baylor's School of Medicine in Temple, Texas to incorporate the department's offerings, including our clerkship, courses, and development opportunities.






