EDUCATION

COURSE HIGHLIGHTS POM I, POM II, and TTM MS1

The Practice of Medicine (POM I and POM II) and Transitions to Medicine (TTM) courses are offered to first-year medical students at Baylor College of Medicine, with significant involvement from Family and Community Medicine faculty. Shruti Varadarajan, M.D., FAAFP is the course director overseeing the curriculum at both the Houston and Temple campuses. Dedicated preceptors guide learners through the fundamentals of patient communication and examination in outpatient settings. These courses prepare and encourage students to advance to the next stage of their medical education by taking part in the FCM Clerkship.

In FY2025, Dr. Varadarajan led precepting faculty through another successful year of POM and TTM, alongside **Kamna Bansal**, **M.D.**, associate course director in Houston, and Ana Crew, D.O., MPH, associate course director in Temple.

- 230 Students enrolled in POM I, POM II, and TTM at Houston and Temple.
- **192** Total preceptors across two campuses.
- **75** Family medicine preceptors, with 48 in Greater Houston and 27 in Temple.
- **30** Total POM faculty facilitators, with 15 from our department.

OTHER ACADEMIC VOICES CME-Credited Webinar Series


CPRIT PROJECT ACTIVITIES




