Dedicated faculty and staff have begun working on initiatives such as the Texas Comprehensive Access and Resources for Early Lung Cancer Prevention (TEX-CARE) Project funded by CPRIT and Consortium for Translational and Precision Health – The Community and Stakeholder Module funded by the NIH/NCATS. ### 25 YEARS WITH BAYLOR COLLEGE OF MEDICINE Professor and Vice Chair of Community Health

Dr. Khan achieved a major milestone in November 2024, celebrating 25 years at Baylor. He has devoted two and a half decades to Family and Community Medicine, starting as an assistant professor and ultimately being promoted to a full professor in the summer of 2021. Dr. Khan has had several departmental roles in clinical and educational capacities, most notably his current appointment as vice chair of community health. Additionally, he is the assistant chief of staff for Ambulatory Care Services with Harris Health.

In his clinical leadership position over the department's Community Health Program, Dr. Khan supervises faculty treating individuals at Harris Health centers and clinics throughout Harris County. As an active physician, he sees patients at the Northwest Health Center. He remains an advocate for providing essential healthcare services to local and international communities. Also, Dr. Khan's positive influence is reflected in our faculty, many of whom are alumni of our residency program, and his continued mentorship of residents and medical students. He is part of our residency's core faculty, with a history as director of the Baylor Family Medicine Residency Program (2007–2013) and associate director of the FCM Clerkship (2001–2007). He received the Leonard D. Moise Teaching Award in June 2020 and 2002, showing his consistent dedication to our mission in education.

## **FEATURED FACULTY GRANTEE PROFILE**By the Agency for Healthcare Research and Quality

Dr. Grigoryan's antibiotic stewardship research was under the AHRQ spotlight in, "Investigating Interventions to Reduce Unsafe Use of Antibiotics," and their weekly newsletter published in November 2024. Throughout her career with the department, she has focused on improving antibiotic use and minimizing the emergence of antimicrobial resistance, a growing global health threat that makes the treatment of infections increasingly difficult. Currently, Dr. Grigoryan is actively involved in three AHRQ-funded grants totaling more than \$7 million.



## RESIDENCY

### **GRANT UPDATES**

#### **Houston and Lufkin**

The department's Baylor Family Medicine Residency Program secured substantial support from the Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board, effective at the beginning of FY2025. Our residency saw an increase in funding to \$207,496, compared to the grant awarded in September 2023. In addition, the Houston track is receiving \$900,000 through June 2026 as part of the Graduate Medical Education Expansion Program.

The Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board is also doubling funding for our rural residency program in Lufkin, Texas to \$1,350,000 through June 2026. This integrated partnership to serve East Texas with St. Luke's Health-Memorial Lufkin has been successful in providing training to our family medicine residents. Currently, we have nine residents in the rural residency track.

### **NEW APPOINTMENT**GHHS Residents and Fellows Chapter President

Dr. Samaan, PGY-2 family medicine resident, was elected as the president of the Baylor College of Medicine Gold Humanism Honor Society Residents and Fellows Chapter for FY2025.
