WHEN PATIENTS CAN'T CONSENT: SHOULD FAMILIES DECIDE?

LEARNING OBJECTIVES

At the conclusion of the session, participants should be able to:

- Describe the substituted judgment standard for surrogate decision-making. Explain the rationale for relying on family members to make substituted judgments for their loved ones.
- Identify what skills, knowledge, and traits are necessary for making substituted judgments. Determine whether family members usually possess those.
- Demonstrate that family members usually have knowledge of their loved ones' lives, goals and values that is essential to substituted judgments but should not be presumed to have other necessary skills traits.
- Outline a model of shared decision-making for substituted judgments that incorporates familial knowledge alongside medical expertise and moral reasoning.
