#### MARCH FOR CHANGE

On April 25th, 2023, we partnered with the March of Dimes to advocate for Texas mothers. 7 students took a shuttle to the Texas capitol to meet with Texas representatives and discuss the importance of postpartum access to care. In total, our team spoke to 20 Texas representatives, senators, or staff about House Bill 12, which would expand postpartum Medicaid to 12 months in Texas. We asked for their support and talked about the difference the Medicaid expansion would make in the lives of moms across the state of Texas. Their mission is to promote healthy behaviors by providing culturally and linguistically proficient education, and facilitating early detection screening and preventative care interventions. Should follow up be needed after screening, Dia de la Mujer contacts individuals and assists in connecting them with

resources closest to them. This was our second year working with Día de la Mujer Latina and our station alone was able to provide screening for over 100 women!
